- You help your teen without being asked
- You run your teens daily schedule of activities
- You step in before your teen makes a mistake

- If they sleep in, don't nag and yell
- If they spend all their money, don't bail them out
- If they have a conflict, don't jump in and try to fix it

Incrementally release control...increasingly hand over the reins. Require them to do things like:

- Earn their own income/Manage their money
- Do their own laundry
- Fix some meals
- Clean the house before and after friends visit

- Make their own appointments
- Keep their own schedule and calendar
- Do (or pay) for car maintenance
